● MPP Visit



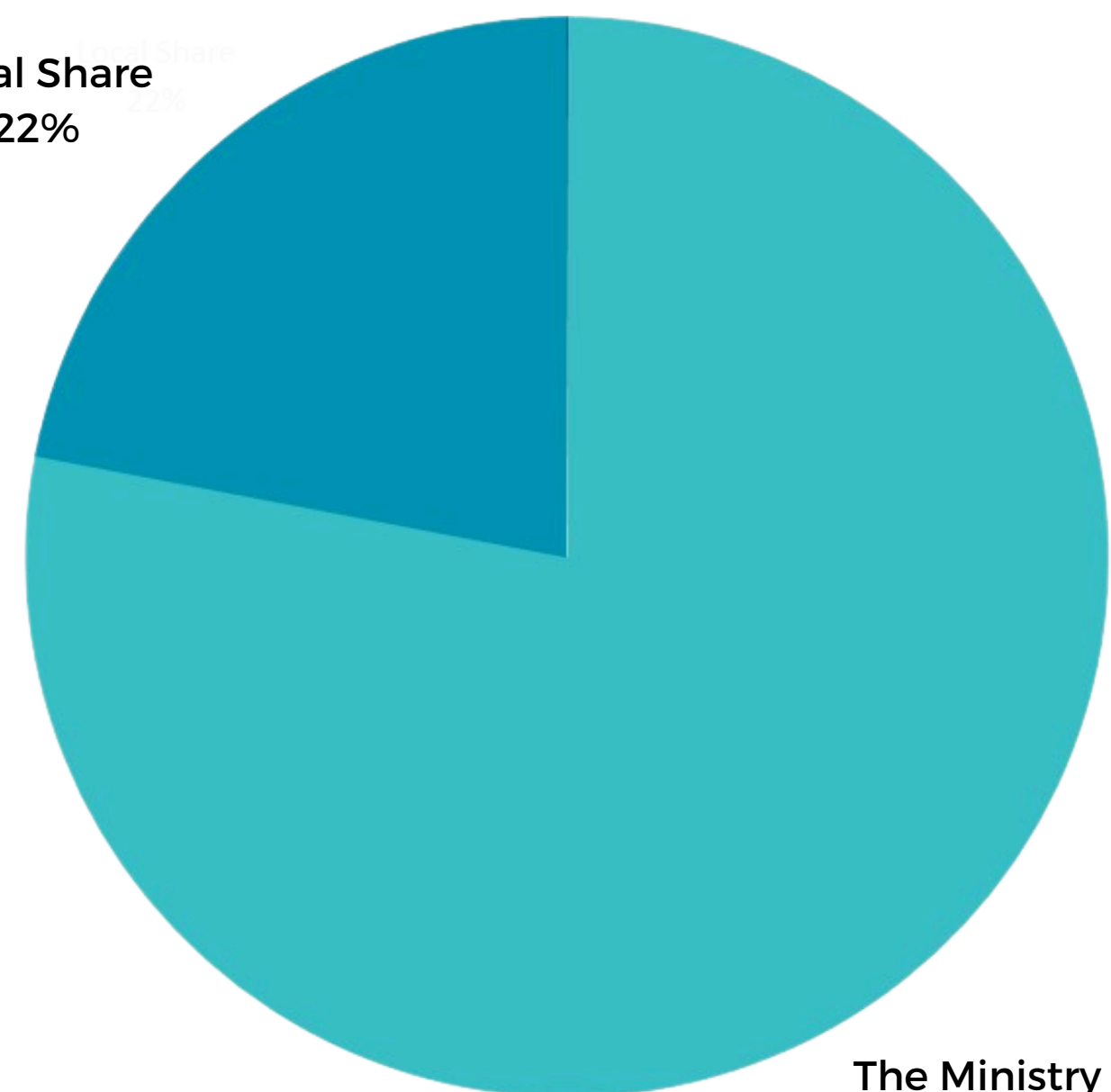

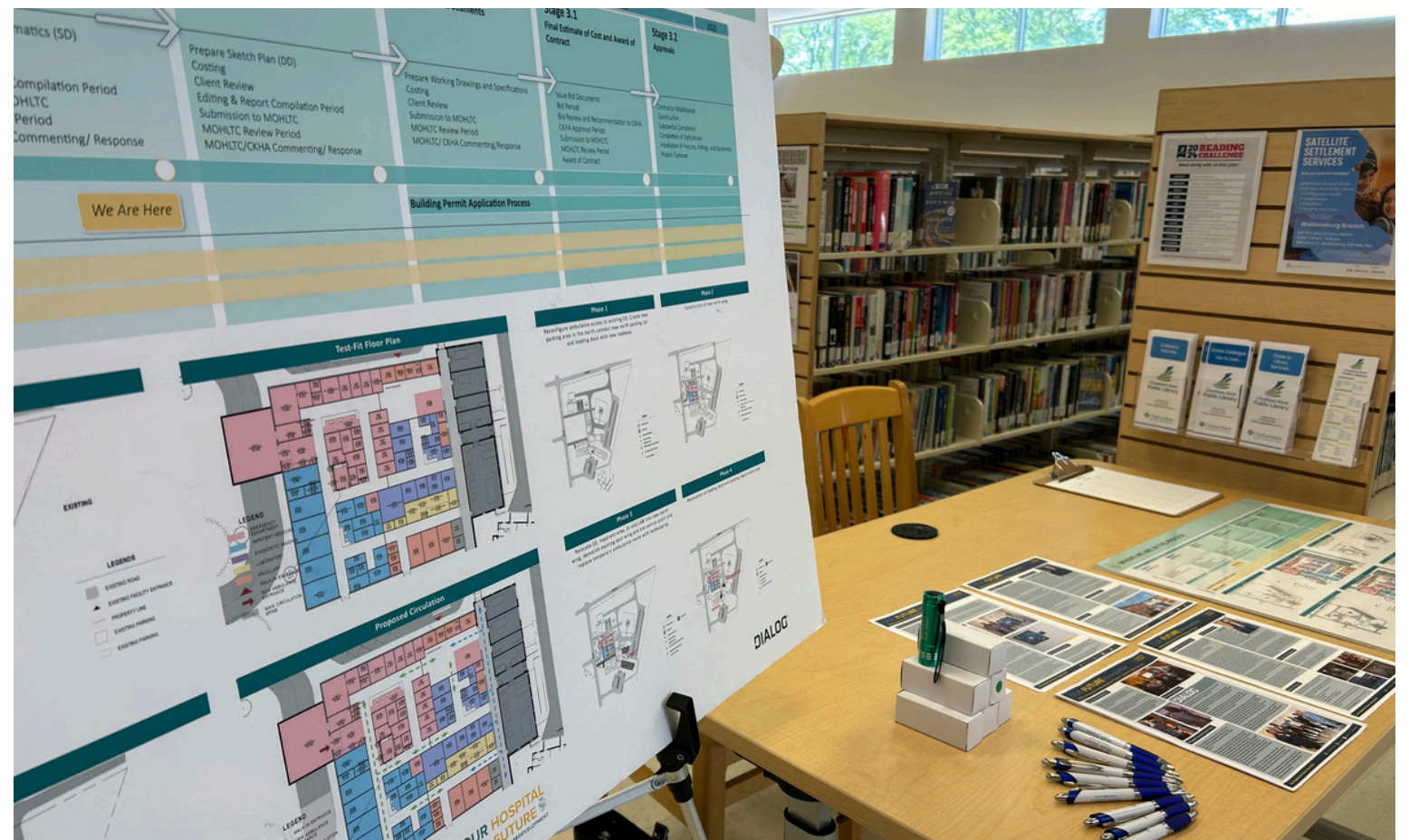

Community Engagement

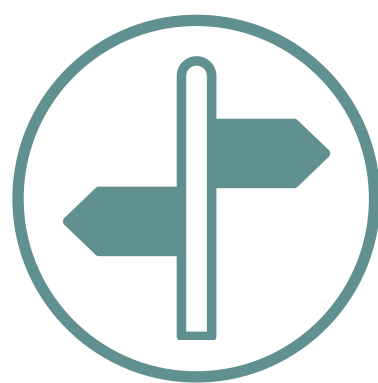
The Our Hospital Our Future (OHOF) Engagement Steering committee concluded its official work on August 22, 2024.

Over the past several months, the OHOF Project Team has worked to gather community input from groups and organizations as directed by the Engagement Steering Committee.

Conducting 1-on-1 interviews with stakeholders as well as engaging with specific groups as recommended by the Committee, the Project Team saw key themes brought forward that will help guide conversations about floor plans in the next phase of work. These key themes included:



There is a need in the new space for a **“Quiet Room”** for grieving families, spiritual care, etc.



There is a need for **improved wayfinding** in the new building



There is a need for **space for specialist clinics** such as Otolaryngology, General Medicine, Surgery, Midwifery, etc. in the new building

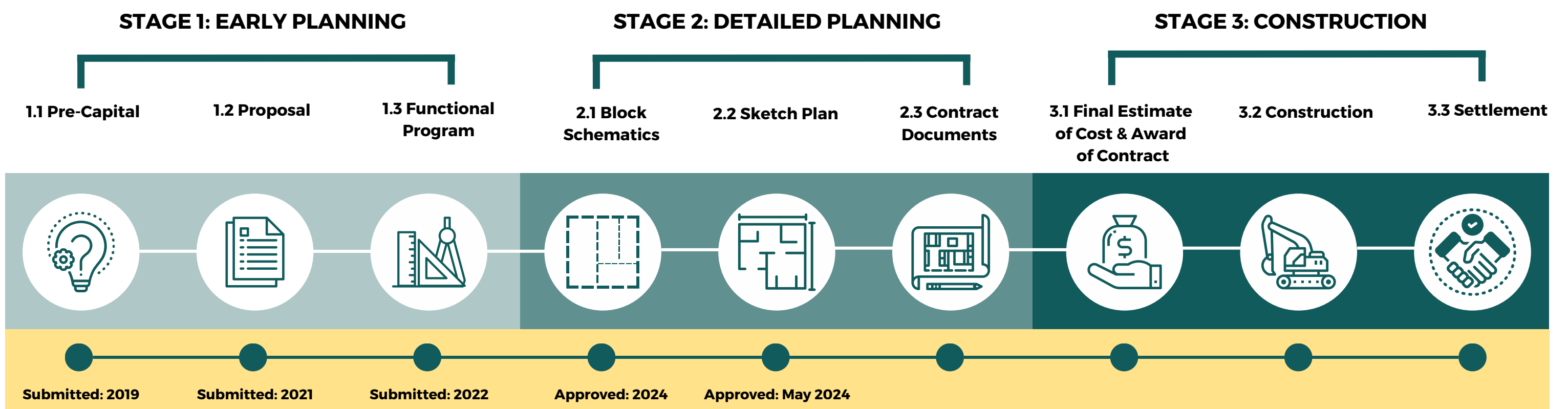


A **culturally safe indoor and outdoor space** must be added to the new building - specifically a **space for Indigenous wellness**



As the new hospital is being built, it must be kept in mind that with the decline of the number of family doctors available, increased need may be placed on the hospital in the future
